The Working Group

- Seafood-Offshore Renewable Energy Working Group Established, within the context of the NMPF, by DHLG, DAFM and DECC.
- Purpose Constructive engagement, promote best practice and safe operations, encourage liaison, publish a standard for communication for all foreseeable development types.
- Recommendations on future arrangements and prioritisation of next issues.
- Present Membership: 17 Seafood Sector Organisations; 4 ORE Developer Organisations; 3 Government Departments; 7 State Agencies, MARA as an observer from January 2024.

Present Status

- National ORE Targets: 5GW by 2030, 20GW by 2040; and at least 37GW by 2050
- MARA established and operational
- 6 Phase 1 Projects granted Maritime Area Consents in December 2022
- 4 of the 6 projects were successful in the ORESS1 Auction in
 - Dublin Array 824 MW
 - Sceirde Rocks 450 MW
 - North Irish Sea Array 500 MW
 - Codling Wind Park 1,300 MW
- 2 Projects were unsuccessful at ORESS1 (Oriel Wind Park and Arklow Bank) and are expected to seek alternative routes to market.

Present Status


- > Future projects will be Plan Led.
- For ORE MARA will only consider applications for Licences or MAC within DMAP areas.
- > The first DMAP proposal is on the South Coast for 900 MW.

- Development Zones will be identified within the DMAP.
- DECC are actively engaged in consultation on this DMAP.



Progress to Date

- Guidance on Engagement published and circulated
- Good engagement at Working Group meetings and Sub-Groups



- Very informative presentations leading to improved understanding of sectoral needs and relevant legislation
- Guidance on Dispute Resolution, Coexistence, and Commercial Operations on Fishing Vessels, at an advanced stage of preparation.

Sub-Group Activity

- Data Hub Work completed, report considered, and being progressed.
- Impacts Work completed, report considered, and being progressed.
- Activity Work completed, report considered, and being progressed.
- Commercial Activity for Fishing Vessels MSO have recently published Exam Directions which will allow this Sub-Group to complete its work.
- Dispute Resolution Mechanism Good progress, Sub-Group still active.
- Coexistence and Related Issues Good progress, Sub-Group still active.

Some Future Issues

- ▶ **Rollout.** The coming months will see the lodgement of the first planning applications and the commencement of the ABP process.
- ▶ **Engagement.** We have agreed guidance. However, engagement is a matter for continuous improvement.
- ▶ Impacts: We need a major project to determine the impacts, if any, of ORE activity on seafood activity.
- Data Hub. We need a major project to develop and manage an accessible data hub.
- ▶ Marine Protected Areas. MPA are not directly part of the Working Group mandate but will impact on Maritime Spatial Planning and therefore are of interest.
